Unreserved/Undesignated Fund Balance Policy

Introduction

General Municipal Law, §6-g authorizes the Fire District to establish (i) a capital reserve fund to finance all or part of the cost of the construction, reconstruction or acquisition of a specific capital improvement, or the acquisition of specific equipment item, and (ii) a capital reserve fund to finance all or part of the cost of the construction, reconstruction or acquisition of a type of capital improvement, or the acquisition of a type of capital equipment.

Policy

- The District shall maintain a minimum unreserved, undesignated fund balance of 15%-35% of the District's annual budget.
- The Fire District serves as an emergency service and must have money available in order to avoid interruption of such service.
- This policy and the year end Unreserved/Undesignated Fund Balance will be reviewed on a yearly basis to assure that the Unreserved/Undesignated Fund Balance is consistently maintained at an adequate level.
