Unreserved/Undesignated Fund Balance Policy

Introduction

General Municipal Law, §6-c authorizes the Water District to establish (i) a capital reserve fund to finance all or part of the cost of the construction, reconstruction or acquisition of a specific capital improvement, or the acquisition of specific equipment item, and (ii) a capital reserve fund to finance all or part of the cost of the construction, reconstruction or acquisition of a type of capital improvement, or the acquisition of a type of capital equipment.

Policy

- The District shall maintain a minimum unreserved, undesignated fund balance of 15%-40% of the District's annual budget.
- The District notes that its "Volatility of Revenues" is extremely high by virtue of the fact that a substantial percentage of its revenues are generated from seasonal water rents which may fluctuate in three consecutive "wet summer seasons" leaving the District with a budget shortfall.
- This policy and the year end Unreserved/Undesignated Fund Balance will be reviewed on a yearly basis to assure that the Unreserved/Undesignated Fund Balance is consistently maintained at an adequate level.
